TODAY'S READINGS: Epistle: Romans 13:11- 14:4 Gospel: Mt 6:14-21

<u>PASTORAL MESSAGE</u>: Tomorrow (Pure Monday) begins Great Lent. As we prepare ourselves to celebrate the Resurrection at Pascha, remember that we must follow the way of the Cross and Christ's suffering for the next 40 days. Part of the discipline of suffering is experienced in fasting. As Byzantine Catholics, we share in the Great Fast with our Roman Catholic, Orthodox, and Liturgical Protestants Brethren. Monday, February 27th is the First Day of the Fast. Strict Fast and Abstinence is required. No meat or dairy products are permitted. Also, doing penance and giving to charity is an expectation throughout Lent. Wednesdays and Fridays during Lent require simple abstinence from meat.

<u>PRESANCTIFIED LITURGY</u>: Due to Father Rella's Military duties, Presanctified Liturgy will only be celebrated on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday during Holy Week. You are encouraged to visit other area Byzantine Catholic or Eastern Rite Catholic Churches when Presanctified Liturgy is being offered; usually on Wednesday and Friday.

If this the first time you are receiving in the Eastern Rite of the Catholic Church, the Priest will say a blessing and give you the Sacred Eucharist with a spoon from the Holy Chalice. There is no need for a response of Amen. "Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. However, per Roman Catholic discipline, "the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of Communion by Christians of these Churches."
