There is no need for a response of Amen. "Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. However, per Roman Catholic discipline, "the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of Communion by Christians of these Churches."
